NHS App changes.

If you use the NHS App, you can now receive appointment reminders and messages from the practice directly in the App instead of via text messages. Just allow the App to send you notifications, and they will automatically switch to come through in this way. We have a nominated person to help you get started - ask for Anna in Admin and she will arrange for you to come in with your phone or device and get you set up – then you can view test results, check on upcoming appointments and book appointments online here.

Appointments -

There are a range of healthcare professionals in the practice — an orthopaedic specialist, a mental health support worker, a paramedic practitioner and others, and all of these can be directly booked into online. We will offer you appointments with the most appropriate person, which may be one of these, or a GP or a nurse, in the quickest possible time frame for your individual problem.

All 'On the day' GP appointments are telephoned first to take a history and decisions made on what to do next — you might just need a prescription and not a journey in to the practice at this stage. Face-to-face GP appointments will be arranged with you the telephone consultation stage. This is the process, and please respect that the call handlers cannot do things differently, however, you will not have to wait twice — all patients who need to be examined after a call will be seen on the same day if that is needed, or on any other day that suits the patient.

We welcome back Dr Elizabeth Pryde who returns from maternity leave this month (November). We have also been in the process of recruiting another GP Partner to future-proof the practice. This has not been an easy task, as there is a national shortage of GPs and GP Partners are hard to find, but we have now recruited and will announce details soon.
